The Technical and Further Education Act of 2017 inserts section 42B into the Education Act 1997 and came into force in January 2018. # Assembly and Careers talks

## General information:



Assemblies for Year 7 to 11 link to topics being covered in the set school programme. They typically have a running time of 15 minutes. The speaker needs to have some 'stage presence' to capture the attention of the whole year group – 300 students. There are audio and visual facilities available in school, remote delivery via 'Teams' is also possible.

Assemblies for Year 12 and 13 have a running time of up to one hour.

Careers talks: We would like to develop a library of careers talks for students to access independently. These would be pre-recorded and shared via our school IT network. The content of talks can have a 'wide brief'; they could be promoting any job or industry sector, they could be from providers giving information about options pathways at transition points at 14 years, post 16 or post 18.

# **Events**

### Year 11 Mock interview event

#### Basic aim and objectives of event:

To provide students experience and a greater understanding of what is expected in a typical interview. They will practice their presentation skills and receive feedback from the person interviewing them.

Students will undertake prior preparation for the event including compiling a CV which will be scrutinised by the interviewer. Students will develop employability skills



and attitudes such as resilience, self-assurance & presentation.

#### What we need:

Employers / volunteers to conduct mock interviews and provide feedback to students on their performance and their CV document. Each interview is approximately 20 minutes and will be held virtually for the 2021/2022 academic year.

# Year 10 CV Writing Workshop

### Basic aim and objectives of event:

Coordinated and run by our PSHE department and the Employer broker company, E4E, students will experience a workshop about effective CV writing hints and tips which will be led by employers. The outcome by the end of the session is for the students to type up their first draft of a CV.



#### What we need:

We need employers / volunteers who are prepared to follow the brief from E4E and then lead activities in the classroom (or virtually). We want to foster in the students;

- confidence
- literacy skills
- IT presentation skills
- resilience

## Year 10 Careers Fair

#### Basic aim and objectives of event:

Our PSHE and Careers Dept will invite Post 16 and 18 pathway providers from Education institutions, Training providers and Employers who may be offering courses, apprenticeships or work experience opportunities to host a 'stall' in our assembly hall. Students will visit the stalls to ask questions, pick up information and become more informed of the range of options on offer when they leave school. As well as **improved knowledge**, by engaging with outside



providers students will further develop skills such as **independence**, **research**, **aspiration**, **self-assurance** and **communication**.

#### What we need:

This is a new event. We need employers / volunteers who are prepared to staff information stalls and engage students in individual conversations during the event. Promotional materials that are information giving will be welcomed should stall holders wish to provide these.

# Year 9 Enterprise Day

### Basic aim and objectives of event:



Coordinated, led and run by our IT, Enterprise and Business faculty, students will be working in groups to organise an event such as a leaver's Ball.

Students will develop employability skills and attitudes such as:

#### What we need:

## Year 8 Creative Industries Day

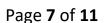
### Basic aim and objectives of event:

# Work Experience

#### Basic aim and objectives:

We want to ensure our students have the greatest opportunities to be 'work ready'. We know how vital this experience is for young people to begin to understand the attitudes, skills and qualifications that employers want.

#### What we need:

A wide range of employers who are able to offer placements or work shadowing experiences to Year 11 or Sixth form students.

Due to the complexity of securing and monitoring suitable work experience placements for over 250 students, the dates for year 11 work experience are usually fixed. 2021/2022 work experience plans remain uncertain due to the ongoing pandemic. If you feel you may be able to offer a suitable placement or work shadowing this year, or in the future, please let us know no firm commitment is required at this time.

The dates for Sixth form work experience are flexible and take place throughout the academic year.

# Curriculum support

#### What we need:

Employers who can be involved in lessons, supporting our teachers and helping them make clear connections to the attitudes and capabilities sought by employers. It is also an opportunity to increase students' knowledge of what careers are 'out there'.
